

## SCRIPTURES AND TOWARD ILLUSTRATING THE SENSE BY PHILOLOGICAL AND EXPLANATORY NOTES

O'erbold art thou in that to me, a stranger, thou hast sent, iii. 83..? ? ? ? ? Saying, "Thy fill of union take; no spy is there on us, Whom we should fear, nor yet reproach our gladness may abate."
